

Lent 2 A Heavenly Perspective

Sometimes, it helps to get a new perspective. A new, fresh, outside perspective. Our God has that perspective and invites us to share it. God sees humanity as we really are. God allows us to see us as we really are. Finally, we are not only people that have a hard time doing what is right, but people that are dead-set on doing what is wrong. It's a stark, realistic view of our sinful nature.

But God also gives us a view of his amazing grace. He has loved us with an eternal love. He has gone to extremes in his loving rescue of us at his Son's cross. He has gone to extraordinary lengths to call us to faith. He is determined not to let us have our own way, but instead to win us over back to himself. When we struggle and fail, we can see things from our gracious God's perspective and take confidence in his saving success.

Sharing of the Peace

Sharing of Peace is an ancient Christian custom, originally referred to as the Kiss of Peace. Paul wrote to the Romans and the Corinthians and the Thessalonians: "Greet one another with a holy kiss." (Rom 16:16,1 Cor 16:20, 2 Cor 13:12, 1 Thess 5:26). There are constant references in the following centuries to Christians sharing a holy kiss during worship, either after the Lord's Prayer or just before communing together as a sign of unity in the presence of Jesus, as Ephesians 4:3 calls us to: "Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace." Eventually the kiss became a handshake with the words, "peace be with you", in most of the Western Christian churches. We'll follow this lovely ancient custom and say, "peace be with you" to those seated around us and perhaps offer a handshake during Lent as a symbol of our reconciliation to each other in the peace of Jesus and as an expression of our love for one another.

For this holy house and for all who offer here their worship and praise, let us pray to the Lord.



FIRST READING Jeremiah 26:8-15

Jeremiah knew the path the Lord had called him to walk—calling the nation to repent—might get him killed. In love for the Lord and for his nation, Jeremiah walked that path willingly.

But as soon as Jeremiah finished telling all the people everything the LORD had commanded him to say, the priests, the prophets and all the people seized him and said, "You must die! Why do you prophesy in the LORD's name that this

house will be like Shiloh and this city will be desolate and deserted?" And all the people crowded around Jeremiah in the house of the LORD.

When the officials of Judah heard about these things, they went up from the royal

palace to the house of the LORD and took their places at the entrance of the New Gate of the LORD's house. Then the priests and the prophets said to the officials and all the people, "This man should be sentenced to death because he has prophesied against this city. You have heard it with your own ears!"

Then the LORD will relent and not bring the disaster he has pronounced against you. As for me, I am in your hands; do with me whatever you think is good and right. Be assured, however, that if you put me to death, you will bring the guilt of innocent blood on yourselves and on this city and on those who live in it, for in truth the LORD has sent me to you to speak all these words in your hearing."


Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

SHARING THE PEACE OF OUR LORD JESUS



DISTRIBUTION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

A NOTE TO OUR GUESTS Children and those who are not communicant members of our church may come forward for a blessing. Those who do are asked to cross their arms on their chest to indicate this.

Prince of Peace practices closed communion, because the Bible teaches it and because we love you. That means we ask that only members of Prince of Peace or other congregations in our fellowship take the Lord's Supper this morning. This is not a judgment of anyone's faith, it is simply our desire to uphold what God says in 1 Corinthians 10 and 11 about who should receive Holy Communion and how. Because we believe from these words that Jesus' body and blood is really present in and with the bread and wine, we want to be sure that it is received in the manner He has commanded us.

The Eucharist is the most ordinary and the most divine gesture imaginable. That is the truth of Jesus. So human, yet so divine; so familiar, yet so mysterious; so close, yet so revealing. But that is the story of Jesus, Who, "being in the form of God did not count equality with God something to be grasped, but emptied himself, taking on the form of a slave, becoming as human beings are; and being in every way like a human being, he was humbler yet, even to accepting death, death on a cross." Is the story of God who wants to become close to us, so close that we can see him with our own eyes, hear him with our own ears, touch him with our own hand; so close that there's nothing between us and Him, nothing that separates, nothing that divides, nothing that creates distance.

Jesus is God-for-us, God-with-us, God-within-us. Jesus is God giving Himself completely, pouring Himself out for us without reserve. Jesus does not hold back or cling to His own possessions. He gives all there is to give. "Eat, drink, this is My body this is My blood. This is Me for you." - Henri Nouwen
